Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

Government Girls' College, Sehore is situated on a 6.7 acre land in Sehore in Bhopal. The College is permanently affiliated to Barkatullah University Bhopal. Hence the syllabuses followed by the College are decided by the University. The College follows the academic calendar prepared by the University and Dpt. of Higher Education of the MP Government. Only a few faculty members are nominated on Board of Studies. More efforts should be made to give feedbackon the course curriculum for improving them.

The Programme, Course specific outcomes are displayed on website and shared with the stakeholders. Detailed analysis may be made regularly to improve the teaching learning process.

As part of the compliance of the former NAAC team suggestions in 2013 three Post Graduate courses have been introduced in Commerce, Sociology and Political science, . The College offers additional inputs by arranging extension and co-curricular activities for improving communication skill, computer skills. Teaching of the University syllabuses is supplemented by special lectures, seminars, etc., efforts are made to use of learnercentric methods The College aims at enhancing employability /entrpreneurship skills of the students.

Rules and regulations made by statutory bodies are followed and discipline is maintained.

However, the College must arrange activities related to IPR and research in order to develop the research aptitude among students. The students must also be given inputs regarding legal provisions, health care and nutrition, and opportunities ahead for ensuring women development and empowerment.

Admissions are done through Government and University specified procedures.

The College organises induction programmes for freshers to appraise them of the rules and regualtions and various activities undertaken by the College. The results of all courses is consistently high which indicates an effective teaching learning process undertaken by the College. The teachers take good amount of interest in the learning and development of the students. Alongwith the University syllabuses the College organises enrichment activities such as guest letures, projects etc. NSS activities, campus cleanliness, awareness regarding social responsibility, women empowerment programmesetc are conducted.

Online classes during the COVID19 pandemic were conducted and study material was provided to the students through Whatsapp groups and Google classrooms satisfactorily. The students and parents expresed their satisfaction about the teaching learning methods during the pandemic.

Internal Continuous Assessment is conducted with the help of which the College identifies slow and advanced learners and efforts are made to help both the categories to improve. A large number of students belong to various reserved categories and the College helps in their academic upliftment. Remedial classes are regularly conducted and students with advanced capabilties are identified and groomed. The blended form of teaching is followed regularly.

The feedback system is in place and action taken reports are available which suggests that the College maintains a healthy dialogue among its stakeholders.

Add on Courses, Certificate Courses, Skill based courses, should be introduced for value addition to the existing courses.

Workshops and conferences in various subjects should be conducted with the participation of the students from different institutions.

The College should pay more attention to developing research and innovations by the faculty and also conduct such activities jointly with the students. Very few faculty members have published research papers or books etc. during the period of assessment Only one faculty has received a minor research grant in 2014. There are faculty members who have cleared NET examinations multiple times-as many as seven times. They need to be encouraged to undertake research. Only one faculty member is an approved Research Guide.

Teachers should be encouraged to attend Conferences organised in other institutions and also conduct Seminars and Conferences in their own institution. Reserach topics could be given to postgraduate students as projects to create a reserach environment and encourage research ecosystem. Fifty percent of the faculty is PhD and has cleared NET they should be encouraged to submit research proposas to various funding agencies to fetch research grants.

Some extension programmes are arranged by the NSS but these need to be increased. Being a Girls' College initiative should be taken, for the community outreach programmes for creating awareness among the women .Blood donation camps, health checkup camps, tree plantation drives, cleanliness drives should be organised in and out of the campus.

Awareness programmes regarding various developmental schemes such as Atm Nirbhar Bharat, Adhunik Bharat, Digital India, Swatch Bharat etc. should be organised.

There are 10 Smart classrooms in the College. The classrooms, have ICT .LAN an Wi Fi facilities. Some classrooms are updated with grants received from RUSA and World Bank.

Adequte number of washrooms, drinking water is available. Sports infrastructure provides a multipurpose sports hall and gymnasium.

Staff Common room should be well furnished and with equipped with ICT facilities.

Following the previous NAAC assement, the number of classrooms have been increased and infrastructure augmented to some extent. With support from RUSA grant and World Bank scheme The renovation of the girls' hostel building and construction of science block, language lab, new comuter lab is in progress.

The existing reading room space is inadequate but the Library is being partially renovated and additional space for reading room will be made available. The footfall in the library should be increased by motivating the students and staff members to utilise the library facilities.

Solar power panels are fitted at some places for harnessing solar energy.

Rain Water harvesting arrangement should be initiated to ensure availability of water and preserve the greenery on the campus. More trees should be planted and adequate care taken to protect them. Vermicomposting unit should be started to convert the waste into organic manure.

A well equipped conference/ multipurpose hall/stage is necessary for providing space for the students to engage in curricular and extrcurricular activities.

With a view to promoting women education the fee structure has been kept very reasonable. Scholarships, books and stationery is provided to students of SC and ST categories according to the norms of the State Government. The students are well disciplined and the atmosphere in the College is peaceful. A Students' Council should be formed in order to establish healthy links between the students and management. The Students' Council can help the College in conducting various academic co-curicular and sports activities. A separate council should be established for each of the post graduate department for the academic extension activities.

The College has a registered alumni association which participates in some activities undertaken by the college. This needs to be further strengthened by involving them in more activities. Alumini Association should be encouraged to contribute to the development of the College by providing financial assistance and participating in Campus placement activities and other beneficial initiatives .Regular meetings should be arranged and suitably documented.

Students' academic and extracurricular performance is appreciated by giving prizes and certificates. Feedback is received from parents during meetings. The College has a grievance redress cell and an equal opportunities' cell.

Voter awareness programmes are conducted. The college website is periodically updated but should be made more user friendly.

Scholarships and freeships offered by the Government are made available to the students.

More efforts need to be taken to help students develop comminication and soft skills, and employability skills. It is also necessary to provide support to the students for preparing for competitive examinations.

The institution is a Government college and follows the rules and regulations set by the State Government. The governance of the institution is reflective of an effective leadership in tune with the vision and mission of the institution.

Organizational structure of the College including Governing Body, admisnistrative setup and functions of various bodies, service rules, procedures, recruitment, promotional policies as well as grievance redressal mechanism are as per Government rules.

The effectiveness of various bodies is evident through minutes of meetings and implementation of their resolutions.

The institution has effective welfare measures like medical reimbursement ,loan facilities and retirement

benefits for the teaching and non teaching staff as per state government.

The College conducts audit regularly.Performance appraisal system is followed for the teaching and non teaching staff

The College exhibits decentralised and participative governance.

Every member gets equal opportunity in the conducting of activities as members of the specific committees entrusted with the activity. Some faculty members are appointed under Janbhagidari Scheme. This is a good developmental scheme which helps the College for its overall development.

Regular meetings of the Staff Council and Academic sub committees are held and suitably documented. The IQAC is quite active, some members are very forthcoming but the entire committee should be proactive and vibrant. The feedback system is satisfactory but can be further improved by maintaining an elaborate report on the action taken and further effect of the action taken.

Teachers need to be encouraged for undertaking more research activities and projects.

The College campus is under CCTV surveillance and has adequate facilities to ensure a secure campus.

The College undertakes counselling but requires to set up a proper counselling cell for the students.

The common room facility exists but needs to be improved with basic furniture, clean washrooms and internet connectivity.

The solid, liquid and e waste managementis not set up in the college. Rain water harvesting structures and utilizationalso needs to be installed.

The College has taken a few steps towards developing a green campus by installing solar panels for renewable energy .ICT based classrooms are available. The library has installed INFLIBNET and installed Soul Staff and students can avail of N-list facility. The College is making efforts to integrate ICT in its curriculum delivery and evaluation processes.

Efforts are being made to make the campus plastic free and paperless. However it needs to be further enhanced.

Tree plantation drive should be enhanced to make the College campus green.

The College organizes national festivals and events to mark the birth anniversaries of some great Indian personalities. Initiatives should be taken to present women role models for the students.

The Abhivyakti activity and Shikshak -Abhibhawak Yojana are conducted successfully for improving communication skills and teacher student bonding.

More efforts should be made for a greener campus, research participation of students, training facilities for competitive examination and a separate placement cell be initiated.
